Ambulances Access:

Access at rear of main stand, emergency vehicle access points, liaison with Police and Stewards that access does not become blocked by private vehicles.

Equipment:

Appropriate life saving equipment is available to the duty first aid crews and Club Doctor. This will include – primary response bag, emergency first aid supplies, blankets etc. The following additional equipment is held in the first aid room:

Stretcher, Defibrillator Response Case, Vacuum Splints, Traction Splint, Box Splints

Receiving Hospitals:

Anyone requiring medical attention will be taken to Jubilee Hospital, Bleachfield Street, Huntly, AB54 8EX. Individuals with serious injuries will be taken to the appropriate receiving hospital by the Ambulance Service. If the Match Risk Assessment indicates that additional arrangements have to be made then these arrangements will be agreed with the appropriate bodies in advance of the game.

Liaison and briefing:

For games where the Risk Assessment has suggested a greater resource is required then the Club Doctor and the duty First Aid teams will attend the Safety Officer's match briefing. This briefing will be held well before the kick off time and First Aid team leaders can then disseminate the information to their own teams prior to deployment.



Medical Role: Club Doctor - Role and Responsibilities

- 1) To be responsible for the medical treatment of all spectators and to ensure additional medical equipment is available, i.e. medical bag.
- 2) To be present for where a crowd is expected to exceed 1,000 or as required by the match risk assessment.
- 3) To ensure the whereabouts of their position in the ground is known to the club safety officer and the duty First Aid Officer at all times. The doctor will be contactable at all times. The Safety Officer must be notified of all requests for the attendance of the doctor.
- 4) To take part in a pre-event briefing with Safety Officer and Officer in charge of the First Aid teams at least 15 minutes prior to the turnstiles opening.
- 5) To assume the role of Medical Incident Officer (MIO) in the initial stages of a major incident, until relieved by a Senior Doctor from the Accident and Emergency Service within NHS. He / She will work in collaboration with the Ambulance Incident Officer (AIO). Appropriate high visibility and personal protective equipment (PPE) should be available.
- 6) To ensure that CPD records are submitted to the Stadium Safety Officer before the commencement of each season, and to notify the Stadium Safety Officer of any intended absences and who the competent replacement will be.

Medical Role: Duty First Aid Crews Roles and Responsibilities

- 1) To standby in position directly beside the field of play and other pre designated positions in the ground (if appropriate). Crews are responsible for ensuring appropriate life saving and personal protective equipment (PPE) is carried at all times.
- 2) To respond to potentially life threatening situations and effect an immediate and appropriate response.
- 3) To liaise with other members of the emergency services, club officials, Club Doctor and members of the voluntary aid societies.
- 4) The Safety Officer in command should be notified of all casualties treated and any other relevant information. A Log of medical incidents, type of injuries treated and any other relevant medical information should be presented to the Safety Officer at the end of the event.
